Firstly, of course, the opportunity to hear world-class musicians playing carefully chosen programmes in an especially beautiful building. But secondly, and importantly, the intimate nature of the Festival makes it possible for supporters and regular attenders to have a real sense of identity with, and of belonging to, the Festival. We depend on the support and enthusiasm of our many individual donors, and the principal means of helping the Festival is by joining the Dolphin Friends.

There are a number of advantages to belonging, according to the level of support you wish to give. Membership in our Friends' programme is the best way to keep in touch with our future plans and to gain access to special events during the year. Membership is for an individual and runs from the beginning of each calendar year, ie 1st January to 31st December. There are three types of Dolphin membership from which to choose:

Silver Dolphin

Annual contribution of £65. Third Priority Booking for Festival concerts and newsletters.

Gold Dolphin

Annual contribution of £125. Second Priority Booking for Festival concerts and newsletters. There is a 'Double Gold' category in which some couples have both chosen to become members – for £250.

Platinum Dolphin

Annual contribution of £500. First Priority Booking, access to rehearsals (by arrangement with the Festival Director) and newsletters.
